1. ****City vs. Starry Sky****: Draw a city skyline flooded with artificial lights on one side, and a natural, star-filled sky on the other.
2. ****Wildlife at Risk****: Illustrate nocturnal animals like owls or sea turtles confused by bright city lights, showing how light pollution affects ecosystems.
3. ****Switch Off, See Stars****: Create a poster-style drawing with a switch turning off city lights to reveal stars and constellations.
4. ****Light Pollution Infographic****: Combine facts, symbols (bulbs, stars, satellites), and text to show causes and solutions of light pollution.
5. ****School Campus Example****: Draw your own school or locality with unnecessary lights on, and then show an eco-friendly version with shielded lighting.
