Non-Point Source Pollution Prevention Checklist

Use this checklist to reduce non-point source pollution at home, in your community, and in policy planning. Small actions add up to big environmental benefits.

[] Ose only the recommended amount of fertilizer and pesticides in gardens and fields.
[] Plant grass, shrubs, or ground cover in bare areas to prevent soil erosion.
[] Avoid pouring oil, paint, or cleaning products into household drains or outdoor surfaces.
[] Wash your car on grass or at a car wash with proper drainage.
[] Always clean up pet waste to prevent bacteria from entering storm drains.
[] Support or organize community clean-up drives for local rivers, lakes, or parks.
[] Build rain gardens or install rainwater harvesting systems at home.
[] Use compost instead of chemical fertilizers where possible.
[] Educate family and neighbors about the dangers of water pollution from runoff.
[] Support policies that enforce sediment control at construction sites.
[] Encourage local governments to create buffer zones along rivers and lakes.
[] Promote tree planting and vegetative barriers in your neighborhood.
